

## The Community

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The City of Piqua is a community of 21,000 people, 45 churches and 200 businesses and manufacturers. It is located on Interstate 75, 50 miles south of Lima, Ohio and 20 miles north of Dayton, Ohio, near the intersection of Interstate 75 and Interstate 70, a significant road intersection in the Midwestern part of the United States.

Piqua City School District's enrollment is 3,708 students and it employs 336 staff members. In addition to its own educational facilities Piqua is a home to Edison State Community College, the Upper Valley Career Centers, the Miami County YMCA and YWCA. Piqua High School, Piqua Junior High School, and Alexander Stadium are located on the same campus as Edison State and Upper Valley Career Center. Piqua City Schools is one of the finest educational settings in the mid-west.

## Qualifications/Responsibilities

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The Treasurer/CFO will be responsible for overseeing the entire financial operation, the accuracy and timelines of reporting, the development of the budget and the Five-Year Forecast, and be creative in developing ways to maximize dollars to educate students. The Treasurer is an active participant on the administrative team and will provide leadership for the district in the area of finance.

The applicants must possess a valid Ohio Treasurer's license and a Bachelors Degree or above. Successful experience as a school Treasurer is preferred. The Treasurer must maintain integrity and high standards of ethics in all matters.

The successful candidate will demonstrate the following:

- Experience with and understanding of State of Ohio software
- Construction experience/OSFC project experience preferred
- Experience with school levies and bond issues
- Leadership skills for staff and committees
- Strong communications and public relations skills

## The School District

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The District serves an area of approximately 55 square miles in and around the City of Piqua. It is located in Miami County in the Southwestern part of the state, comprised of the City of Piqua, Washington Township and Springcreek Township, and is residential, agricultural and industrial. It has a diversified industrial base with over 90 industries and 1,000,000 square feet of commercial space.

The District provides a full range of education programs and services to 3,708 students. These include elementary and secondary curriculum offerings at the general, college preparatory, and vocational levels, a broad range of co-curricular and extracurricular activities, and special education services. In addition, the District provides state-financed assistance to non-public schools located within its boundaries. This assistance is accounted for in a special revenue fund.

In November of 2011 the community approved a bond issue of 4.92 mills (4.42 + 0.50) for 29 years. This bond issue amounts to a \$54.8 million joint venture between the OSFC and Piqua City Schools. The building project is building 2 new Pre-K through 3 buildings and 1 new grade 4 through 6 building. This project will also include abating and demolishing 7 of our 8 current elementary buildings. The 2 new primary buildings are located on 2 of our current sites and the 1 new intermediate building will be located on the former local hospital site near the center of town. Completion is anticipated sometime during 2015.

Good schools are important to the quality of life in Piqua and also to maintaining property values. But beyond these considerations, the educational program itself is of primary importance.

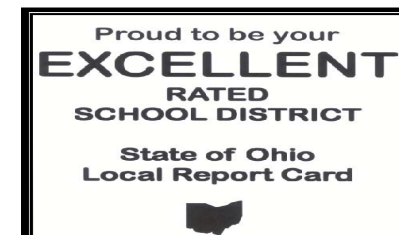
